European Masters Athletics Championships Stadia (EMACS) 2025 will take place in Madeira Island, Portugal, in particular Ribeira Brava, Câmara de Lobos, Funchal and Machico, from 8th to 19th of October 2025, with the strong support of the Local Municipalities, the European Master Athletics and the Portuguese Athletics Federation (FPA).

1.General Information

EMACS is an international event held every two years even if, cause of the pandemic, the 2021 edition was not carried out. It is open only to athletes, both men and women, aged 35 years and over. The athletes will compete in the stadia disciplines – and also in several Non Stadia events (Race Walk, Road Running, Cross Country).

The event will last 11 days, with one no-competition day dedicated to the EMA General Assembly and to Seminars; it will start with an opening ceremony (8th of October) and a parade in the Funchal centre. The closing ceremony will take place on 19th of October in Ribeira Brava stadium.

2.EMACS in numbers

At EMACS 2023 almost 5.000 Master Athletes coming from all the European Countries and from several non-European Countries, gathered at the Abruzzo Region to celebrate the lifelong joy of sports and foster international friendship, understanding and cooperation. The first European Masters'/Veterans' Athletic Championships Stadia was held in 1978 in Viareggio (Italy), and ever since it has been staged every two years.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS AND PROCEDURE

General Rules

Competition will be held under World Athletics regulations as modified for Masters by WMA via their Competition Rules and any other special rules specified for this competition.

General Information

Athletes must register online. See below for details. All entries must include full payment to be considered valid.

The registrations deadline is Tuesday, 2 September 2025 (until 24:00 CET).

No registrations will be accepted after the entry deadline.

All entries are subject to validation by each athlete's respective Member. Members will confirm the athlete's date of birth, citizenship and/or residential qualifications and other relevant requirements. After an athlete's registration has been validated, its status will display as "accepted" on the list of entries. Validation is a manual process that each Member completes, so there will be some time (days or weeks) between when you submit your registration and when it is validated. Athletes who have questions about the status of their registration should contact their Member. For athletes who reside in a country where there is no EMA National Masters Member or where the Member fails to fulfill its obligations, their registrations will be subject to the approval of the EMA Council.

Online Entry Procedure

- 1. Go to **www.emacs-madeira2025.com** and complete the online registration form prior to the registration deadline.
- 2. Submit payment by credit card (Visa or Mastercard) at the end of the registration process.
- 3. Print the confirmation screen for your records.
- 4. Your Member will then validate your registration.

Athlete's Party

The Athlete's Party will take place on the **14 October 2025**, the evening before the day without competitions. Music, food and a lot of beer for everybody! Location will be announced.

The Athlete's Party is 30€, you can buy the entry ticket together with your registration or at the accreditation.

EMA National Member Requirements

EMA requires that each Member validate all relevant entries electronically via the online entry system.

The Local Organizing Committee ("LOC") will accept only those entries that have been validated by Members.

All entries must be validated before 9 September 2025.

Any entries that have not been validated by this deadline may be rejected, and those athletes will be ineligible to compete.

Members will receive communications regarding the entry process prior to the start of registration.

Members that do not receive these communications should contact the EMA Secretary or EMA IT Manager.

Vaccinations and Travel Insurance

It is recommended that athletes and other accompanying persons obtain any required vaccinations and check that their medical insurance covers travel and accidents in Portugal.

Qualifications for Entry

The European Master Athletics Championships are open only to men and women who were born on or before 9 October 1990 and who are physically fit. Entry signifies that each competitor must follow the rules laid down by the technical and organizing committees. EMA has the right to reject entries of athletes considered ineligible through misconduct or other disciplinary related matters.





Registration Pack and Accreditation Pass Collection

All registered athletes, accompanying persons and supporting personnel must collect their registration pack from the Accreditation area within the Welcome Centre during operating hours. The registration pack will include an accreditation pass, competition handbook (if ordered), competition numbers (bibs) with pins, and pre-ordered merchandise.

STEP 1

Visit the Accreditation area to obtain your bibs and accreditation before competing.

STEP 2

Stadia Events: Athletes must complete their final confirmation by 18:00 on the day before their event, either at the Accreditation Centre or online.

Non-Stadia Events (Cross Country, Road Races, and Road Walk): Final confirmation is not required.

STEP 3 Report to Call Room at appropriate time prior to event start time. There is one Call Room for all events at each venue

Accreditation Passes

Accreditation is a process designed to ensure that EMACS 2025 participants and guests are provided with the appropriate level of physical access to venues and areas. All registered athletes, accompanying persons and supporting personnel (e.g. media, medical staff, and team managers) will receive an event accreditation pass upon registering online. To collect their accreditation pass, registered athletes, accompanying persons and supporting personnel must present a passport or other government-issued identification (with picture included). Team managers are permitted to collect the accreditation of an athlete and make confirmation of events for an athlete. Accompanying people will also receive an accreditation bracelet, which will give them access to the areas and services reserved for them, including the transportation buses.

The accreditation pass is only valid for the person to whom it is issued and cannot be transferred or sold.

The EMACS Madeira 2025 accreditation pass must be always displayed in the designated EMACS 2025 venues/areas, except when athletes are competing.

The coding on each pass determines the access privileges provided to the person. Control points will be managed by contracted security, volunteers or staff. Access to the competition areas at each venue, will be restricted to those with a valid reason and appropriate accreditation pass. If a person violates the access control rules, the contracted security personnel will hold that person until a resolution is determined (e.g. revocation of accreditation).

Please do not forget that accreditation and Final Confirmation (for each Event) are not the same thing. After accreditation, it is NECESSARY to go directly to the Final Confirmation desks or to completed it online.

Accreditation for Supporting personnel

The team managers' accreditation pass will allow them access to the team manager meetings and team managers' office. A physio staff accreditation pass will be issued to registered team sports medicine professionals (team physiotherapists). Suitable space will be dedicated to these services at the Main Stadium in Ribeira Brava - Centro Desportivo da Madeira.

Registered and accredited media (e.g. journalists, photographers, videographers etc.) will have access to a dedicated 'media zone'. See Media section for further information. The recognized Team Manager for each country shall collect all credentials for team support personnel (including physios, journalists, and managers) at the Welcome Centre.

Shuttle buses (with permanent meeting points): you can only get on if you wear the event bracelet (there will be LOC staff who will check who can get on).

- Distribution and receipt of Team Manager meeting question forms, relay entry forms, team forms for Cross-Country, 10 Km and 20 Km Race Walk, Half Marathon and 10 Km Road Race (before 18:00)
- Team Manager meeting room bookings
- Processing of appeals (receipt and return of appeal forms)
- NON STADIA Team registrations (the day before the Event until 18:00)
- Schedule for award ceremonies
- Various technical information

Information

The information boards in the Welcome Centre will display:

- General event information (e.g. transport)
- Changes for competition times, if required due to unforeseen circunstances

Language Services

As the LOC in Madeira will welcome guests from many different countries, providing language services is vital to ensuring a high level of customer service. The official language of the event is English, however, an effort will be made to have translation services for Spanish, German and French, in addition to other languages. Volunteers with these and other language skills will be available at the Welcome Centre.

Booking of meeting rooms

Each team will have the opportunity to book a meeting room at the Ribeira Brava Stadium, subject to availability, for 1 hour per day at no additional cost. For further reservations, € 60 per hour will be charged.

If there is a need for drinks, food, etc., everything must be booked the day before to the catering service available at the Ribeira Brava Stadium.

Confirmation / Withdrawal

The final confirmation must be made either at the Accreditation or online.

The deadline for the confirmation is set for all the events at 18:00 of the day before the competition.

Final confirmations will not be accepted after the deadline above.

The withdrawals (cancellation from a specific event after the confirmation) must be made **up to 2 hours before the Call Room time** for that event.

Those athletes who, after the confirmation, do not appear in the Call Room without having communicated the withdrawal, will be considered DNS (Did Not Start).

Final confirmations - relays

The preliminary composition of the Relay Races must be declared to the TIC, no later than 18:00 (6pm), on the day before the competition, using the forms made available by the LOC. Please note that a fee of € 30 per relay must be paid directly upon registration.

The final composition of a team and the order of running for a relay shall be officially declared no later than the published first call room time (the time by which the athletes must be present in the Call Room).

Technical Meeting

The first Technical Meeting will take place on the **8 October** in the Museu da Electricidade - Casa da Luz at 16:00.

The meeting will be held by EMA Technical Delegates Vesna Repic-Cujic and Janusz Krynicki in English language. To obtain detailed answers, Team Managers should send the written questions to the LOC at the email address **emacsmadeira@gmail.com** no later than 8 October at 12:00. All EMA member countries can send to the Technical Meeting a maximum of 2 delegates and 1 interpreter (if necessary).

Daily technical meeting

Every day (except 9, 15 and 19 October) at 09:00 EMA and LOC will hold a briefing for all the Team Managers, at the main stadium in Ribeira Brava, on the ground floor.

During the meeting, all questions received by the respective TIC within the day before in writing will receive an oral response. The meetings will last no longer than 1 hour.

Teams Info Point Board

The Teams Info Point Board will be set up close to the Main entrance of the Main Stadium Ribeira Brava.

Safety and Security

1. Doctors and emergency

First aid

In all places of competition (stadia and road races) medical services (doctors and first aid personnel) will be provided, which will allow athletes to access medical care before, during (when the WA/WMA rules allow it) and after the competition. They will wear well identified jacket, making them easy to spot.

First aid services will run during the competition days from half an hour before the start to half an hour after the end of the last competition.

Medical emergency

For emergency services or ambulance, call the following number: 112.

Team Physios Service

For the physio service provided by the teams, there will be areas available in the warm up areas of each stadium, with access to a shower, toilet, changing rooms etc. All teams should cover their expenses in relation to the service they provide.

The LOC will provide physio service for a fee, to whoever may need it.

2. Insurance

All athletes are invited to learn about any additional insurance needed in Portugal in addition to those of the country of origin. EU Citizen: The European Health Insurance Card covers most medical care, except for emergencies and emergency repatriation at home. Non-EU citizen: to know if there is a reciprocal agreement for free medical access in Portugal. Make sure that health insurance covers the worst possible scenario, such as an accident that requires an emergency flight to your residence.

Teams/individuals are responsible for sufficient medical insurance to cover, for example, any hospital treatment, non-urgent treatment or emergency transport for their team members.

3. Availability and health assistance costs

Medical care is available everywhere in the country by contacting a doctor during consultation hours.

In case of urgent need for medical assistance outside office hours, contact number 112.

For minor issues, pharmacists can give advice and sell over-the-counter drugs. They can also advise when more specialized help is needed and direct them in the right direction.

4. Drinking water

In Madeira Island and in particular in competition locations, tap water is 100% safe.

5. Prohibited objects and practices

The following articles and practices are prohibited in EMACS 2025 races and event venues:

- Glass objects
- Explosivé devices
- Weapons
- Large banners or banners with commercial messages or offensive references
- Use, possession and supply of illicit drugs
- Illegal use, illegal possession and illegal supply of prescription drugs
- The smoke
- The distribution of flyers or any material not approved by EMACS 2025, whether for the purpose of the promotion or any other comunication
- Unauthorized tables or retail stands, trade, political and/or religious groups
- Articles or practices prohibited by law in Portugal

6. General advice

Limit the amount of money you carry with you.

Keep a copy of your passport and credit card numbers separate from your wallet and money.

Competition information

1. Final registrations

Late registrations are not possible.

Only athletes registered in time before the deadline and visible on the official starting lists are eligible to compete: Participation lists:

2. Age groups

The age group of an athlete must be determined based on their date of birth. During all championships, an athlete must compete in the age group for which they qualify on the first day of competition (09/10/2025) of these championships and in no other age group, except in the cases permitted by specific rules of team and relay.

For records, the age group of an athlete shall be determined by the athlete's date of birth on the day of the record, as long as all the rules of competition apply to both the old and new age groups.

3. Timetable

Daily timetables are available in **APPENDIX 1.** (To be officially published on September 15th)

4. Schedule changes

Any changes to the schedule will be communicated to the Team Managers during the daily technical meeting. They will also be published on the appropriate notice boards and online at the EMACS 2025 website. No competition or phase of it must begin earlier than announced in the program.

5. Events changing

Competitors are not allowed, after the publication of the final lists, to add events to those they are already registered, or take the place of another athlete in an event. Those who do not follow these rules will be disqualified from all events.

6. Training Schedules

The competition sites at Câmara de Lobos, Ribeira Brava and RG3 (Funchal) will be open for training on the following times and days:

Race procedures

1. Participation rules

EMACS 2025 are governed by the technical rules of the WA and the WMA.

All documents are available online at: http://www.european-masters-athletics.org/ and https://world-masters-athletics.org/
During EMACS 2025 the health of the athletes in compliance with the regulations will be supervised by a technical committee.

This committee will work closely with the Safety Officers during the event.

2. Implements and other technical equipment

Official implements

The LOC will provide implements for all throwing events during official training sessions and for events held at Ribeira Brava Stadium and RG3 in Funchal. The full list of official implements will be published in advance of the competition.

Personal implements

Personal implements are allowed, provided they are World Athletics certified, readily identifiable, and have been checked for compliance with World Athletics Rules. Additionally, they must be made available for use by all competitors during the event in which the owner is participating.

Submission: Personal implements must be submitted to the TIC at Ribeira Brava no later than 18:00 on the day before the event.

Tagging and Transport: The LOC will verify the compliance of personal implements, tag them, and ensure their transport directly to the competition site (either in Ribeira Brava or RG3 in Funchal).

Non-compliant Implements: If a personal implement does not meet the specifications or cannot be identified, the relevant athlete or team will be notified the night before the competition via the TIC. An explanation will be provided, and the implement will be returned through the TIC.

Collection: Accepted personal implements can be collected at the TIC in Ribeira Brava after the event, during TIC's working hours.

Poles for Pole Vault

Poles are strictly personal, and each athlete must carry and use their own poles.

Personal poles must be presented for competition at the TIC at Ribeira Brava by their respective athletes by 18:00 on the day before the event, properly identified. The LOC will ensure the transport of the poles from the TIC to the event venue. After the event, the poles will be returned to the TIC for collection by their owners.

If an athlete does not bring their own poles, the LOC provides a rental service:

- Training: Rental of a specific pole (must be requested in advance). When renting poles for training, the athlete must specify the exact pole they require, based on the list of available dimensions provided in **Appendix 2.**

- Pole Vault Event: Access to the full pool of available LOC poles. Athletes renting poles for the competition may choose any pole from the LOC's available inventory, following the same principle applied to personal implements in throwing events. However, they are not permitted to use poles brought/owned by other athletes.

Requests of poles (for training and for the Pole Vault Event) must be made at the TIC.

(See pole rental pricing on page 11).

No athlete will be allowed to participate in a Pole Vault Event without either bring one or more personal poles or, alternatively, by renting the service of poles pool from the LOC.

Note: The LOC is unfortunately unable to provide transportation services for personal poles to or from the airport or hotels.

3. Call Room

The Call Room will be located in each of the competition fields, indicated with appropriate signs and will be the last checkpoint. All competitors must present themselves in person to the call room at the time indicated below. All athletes are required to report to the Call Room before any competition for athlete control. The Call Room for the Non Stadia events will be located in every location.

Only athletes participating in competitions are allowed access to the call room. This area will not be accessible to Team Managers. **Athletes must report to the Call Room no later than the times shown below:**

- Race on track: 20 minutes before start
- Pole Vault: 50 minutes before the start
- High Jump: 40 minutes before the start
- All other events: 30 minutes before the start

The judges of the competition will accompany the athletes from the Call Room to the start/Event site, respective platform or competition area, where athletes will have time for the final warm up before the beginning of the heats etc.

The competitors of the Half Marathon, the 10 Km Road Race, the Cross Country and the Road Race Walk must enter the starting area through the Call Room not later than 30 minutes before the start of the race to be subjected to a final check.

The athletes of Combined Events and Throwing Pentathlon must only confirm themselves at their first event of the day.

Once in the Call Room, the athletes will be identified by their accreditation badge and their bibs. During the stay, the judges will check clothes, shoes, personal items, etc. if necessary.

Competitors are not allowed to bring mobile phones or communication equipment to the competition area.

At the appointed time, the athletes will be reunited, and the competition judges will lead them to the competition area. Team Managers must inform all their athletes about the times they must enter the Call Room and the procedures to be followed within it.

Athletes who have confirmed start and are unable to present themselves in time to the Call Room, without a valid reason (for example, medical exemption, etc.) will be excluded from participating in that particular event.

Those athletes will be considered DNS (Did Not Start).

4. Team clothing and equipment

In accordance with the WA/WMA rules, only official uniforms of the affiliated teams can be worn. Clothing must also comply with WA rules. Competitors must wear the uniform approved by their national federation. Advertising on athletes' clothing must comply with WA regulations. In relay events, all team members must all wear uniforms which clearly identifies the country they represent. Only the official uniform will be approved for use during the competition in the championships.

The non-compliance will make the disqualification of the team indispensable.

Award ceremonies are considered as part of the competition.

5. Spikes and soles

The Call Room staff will be responsible for checking the spikes on the athletes' shoes. The shoes and the soles thickness must comply with the WMA Competition and Technical Rules 2025.

The maximum spike length is 9mm in all events, except for the high jump and javelin throw with a maximum length of 12mm. Shoes with spikes are allowed (but not necessary) in the Cross Country Races.

6. Results Announcement

The results of all the races will be displayed online on the EMACS 2025 website, under "Results": https://www.emacs-madeira2025.com/

7. Protests and Appeals

Athletes, or their representatives, may present a protest regarding the conduct of the event or the results. The protest must be made orally to the relevant Referee, either directly or via the Technical Information Centre (TIC), within a maximum of 30 minutes after the official results of the event have been published.

If the athlete does not agree with the Referee's decision, they may submit a written appeal to the Jury of Appeal through the TIC within 30 minutes of the Referee's decision.

An appeal fee of €100 must be paid, which will be reimbursed if the appeal is upheld.

In the case of events held at competition venues other than the Ribeira Brava stadium, the Appeal should be submitted through the LOC representative present at that competition site.

Protests regarding an athlete's eligibility to compete in these Championships must be submitted to the Technical Delegate before the start of the Championships. If the issue cannot be resolved before the competition begins, the athlete will be permitted to compete "under protest". The matter must then be referred to the EMA Council for a final decision.

8. Transponder Timing System

A transponder timing system will be used in all the Non-Stadia events (Half Marathon, 10 Km Road Race, 10 Km & 20 Km Road Race Walk and Cross Country).

Each athlete in these events will receive a transponder in their registration package after registration. The transponder will be an integrated part of the bib number.

The race number containing the transponder must always be worn correctly (on the chest) during each event in which it is requested. Instructions on the correct use of the transponder in the registration package. Athletes may be required to pass through a test area before the start of each event to verify that the appropriate transducer is positioned and that the transponder is functioning properly.

9. Records

In the event that a world, European or championship record is obtained during this competition, this will be automatically detected by the EMA Record Manager. Those requesting the completion of national record modules must do so only through their Team Manager at the TIC. This operation must not be done by the athletes themselves.

10. Safety Officers

Safety Officers are appointed for these Championships and will be identified with a specific uniform. The WMA Rule 3.2. will be applied.

11. Visually impaired/blind, deaf and hearing impaired athletes Deaf and Hearing impaired athletes

The use of lights, by deaf or hearing impaired athletes only, at the start of races is allowed and is not considered assistance. It should however be the obligation of the athlete or their team for the financing and supply of such equipment and its compatibility with the start system in use, unless at a particular meeting where there is an appointed technical partner who can provide it.

Blind and Visually impaired athletes

Pursuant to the provisions of the WA rules and pursuant to this regulation, the visually impaired athletes who do not need a guide are allowed to compete in the championships.

The blind or visually impaired athletes who need a guide are allowed to participate in the championships (only from 1500 and more on track, and to the non stadia events) they will compete for the European title.

The guides can be positioned only behind or on the side of the competitor. A rope/cord between the athlete and the assistant can be used, but not to pull the competitor. (WA rule 18.8).

Track events

1. Starters' command

Starter control will be provided in English. Up to 400 m, the following commands will be used:

- "on your marks"
- "set"
- Gunshot

For the 800m races and beyond, the following commands will be used:

- "on your marks"
- Gunshot

2. Starting blocks

Starting blocks are not mandatory and athletes are not required to have both hands in contact with the track for the start of a race. Only the starting blocks provided by the organizers will be admitted.

3. False start

For running events, the athlete who makes a false start will be notified with a yellow/black card. If a false start is committed twice, the athlete will be notified with a red/black card and will be disqualified from the competition. The rule also applies to the Combined Events.

4. Lap timing and counting

In distance events, there will be timepieces clocks on the 400m. The lap counts will be assigned to the athletes and recorded so as to help the athlete's placement correctly.

5. Finals composition

The composition of the finals will be managed under the WMA rules.

The participation of the Non Europeans athletes will be allowed as for the regulations from page 30.

In track races above 1500m, the age categories with many participants will be divided into series. Athletes without accreditation will be placed in the slowest series. The final results will take into account all the series and will classify the athletes according to time. For advancement procedures and hurdles specification see **Appendix 3. (and WMA regulations)**

6. Relays (4x100m, 4x400m, 4x400m Mix Relay)

The temporary composition of the Relay Race must be declared to the TIC no later than the day before the competition before 6.00 pm using the forms made available by the LOC. Please note that a fee of € 30 per relay must be paid directly upon registration.

Only **one team per Country** will be accepted in each age group. Athletes can run in their own age group or in a younger age group to complete a team. The age category of a Relay Race will be determined by the age of the youngest runner.

All athletes must have attended a single event and must wear their bibs on the back.

Starting order for the mix relay: man/woman/man/woman.

For the Mix Relay the age group of the team is the age group of the youngest athlete, on the entry form and each relay must compete at least one (1) male and one (1) female of the age group of the team.

Field Events

All competitions will be directly final. There will be no qualifying stages.

1. Horizontal jumps and throws

All athletes are admitted to three trials. After the preliminary phase, the first eight competitors will be able to benefit from a further three trials. If more athletes are tied on eighth place, all of them will be admitted to the final phase.

However, in competitions which have more than 22 confirmed athletes they will be conducted as follows: the participants will be divided in two groups according to the results reported in their entry. The half with the lowest ranked results will be in the first group and they will have their three trials. The half with the highest ranked results will be in the second group and they will have their three trials immediately after first group. The participants with the eight best valid performances overall will have three additional trials.

For the Non European athletes, see the regulations from page 30.

For the implements weights, see Appendix 3. (or WMA Regulations)

2. Vertical Jumps

Each field event will be conducted as a final (no qualifying rounds or preliminaries will be played). The various age groups will be combined as needed. If more than one age group is joined, the winner of each group can request height increases at will outside the progression. The rest of the competitors cannot jump to these heights but must continue in the normal progression.

For the Non European athletes, see the regulation from page 30.

For high jump and Pole Vault, both feet must be lifted off the ground during the jump. Athletes are allowed to touch the landing area before passing the bar, as long as they do not give the athlete any advantage as determined by the competition judge. The athlete can be given a foul if it is decided by the judge in the event that the athlete has benefited from having hit the fall zone before landing.

Starting heights and progression during the competition

Initial heights and progression will be indicated during the first Technical Meeting. In any case, the competition will not start at a height:

- lower than that agreed in a technical meeting
- less than what is allowed by the equipment available in the field
- less than the height of the landing area

3. Combined Events

The groups will be formed according to the number of registered athletes, also combining different age groups.

Each group will have a dedicated referee who will move from one competition area to another. The referee is responsible for verifying the results and sending the results to the Data Management Office and is the official source of information for the group on the location and calendar of events.

The final points awarded will be calculated according to the WMA 2023 system for the Combined Events.

Non stadia Events

1. Half Marathon

The Half Marathon will be the closing event of EMACS 2025 with a running event aimed at both EMACS and open race competitors.

The race will start and finish in the center of Funchal, it will show everything that represents the city.

Men and women will run together, and in the same way the EMACS 2025 athletes and the athletes participating in the open races. There will be a separate start group for EMACS 2025 participants. The age of the competitors can be identified by the bibs on the back. The chip must be worn on the front.

All competitors must present themselves in the Call Room no later than 30 minutes before the start. There will be a Call Room/check-in before the start, with toilets and drinking water available.

The medical staff will be around the course and near the finish line.

Provided supplies will be available on the course with water and energy drink (carbohydrates). The refreshment stations will be at: 5km, 10km, 15km and at the finish line. **There are no personal refreshment stations. Time limit: 3:00hrs.**

2. 10km Road Race

The Road Race will be a running event for both EMACS and open race competitors. The race will start and finish Funchal downtown, it will pass through the center of city and will show everything that represents the city.

Men and women will run together, and in the same way the EMACS athletes and the competitors participating in the open races. There will be a separate start group for EMACS participants. The age of the competitors can be identified by the bibs on the back. The chip must be worn on the front.

All the athletes must present themselves in the Call Room no later than 30 minutes before departure. There will be a Call Room/check-in before the staring area, with toilets and drinking water available.

The Medical Staff will be around the course and near the finish line.

On the course will be sponging station where will be available water, energy drink (carbohydrates), energy bars and fruits. The sponging stations will be at 5 km and at finish line. **There are no personal refreshment stations.**

3. Road Race Walk (10Km e 20km)

The Road Race Walk Races planned are: 10km and 20km for all categories.

The race will be judged by international and national Race-Walking Judges who are part of the EMA Race Walk Judges Panel that will be present along the way to check for possible violations of WA and WMA rules.

One Posting Board shall be placed on the course before the finish, to keep athletes informed about the number of Red Cards that have been sent to the Chief Judge for each athlete.

The competitors will receive notices from the judges (Yellow Paddle) with the symbol of the offence on each side.

An athlete who is disqualified shall immediately remove the bibs and leave the course.

The races will take place in Machico along a traffic-free circuit of 1km. A display clock will be placed in the finish area. The medical staff will be around the course and near the finish line. There will be a Penalty Zone (WMA rule 54.7.3).

Times: During the race the athletes must wear both bibs received; the breastplate with the chip in front and the other on the back.

Supplies: One refreshment station (for 20 Km only) and one water station will be available each lap. Refreshments are personal, so athletes must bring their own refreshments. One or two officials per team will be allowed to deliver refreshments to their athletes, who should position themselves behind or beside the table (no more than 1 metre away), but not in front of the table. They must not enter the circuit or obstruct any athlete. **Time limits 20 Km Road Walk: - Intermediate 10 Km - 1:45 hours | - 20 Km - 3:30 hours.**

4. Cross Country Races (8Km distance for M35-M65 and W35-W65; 6Km distance for M70+ and W70+)

The Cross Country event will take place at Chão das Feiteiras.

In the area of the course will be set up all the services necessary for the conduct of the races.

Personal drinks will not be permitted. The medical staff will be present on the course and at the beginning and at the finish line. Athletes are advised that any assistance by persons not in competition is prohibited.

5. Team events (Half Marathon, 10K Road Run, Road Race Walk 10km/20km and Cross Country Races)

In the Half Marathon, 10K Road Races, Road Race Walk 10km and 20km and in Cross Country Races a team ranking will be drawn up with the aggregation of the time of the three best athletes of each team.

There are two types of teams in EMACS 2025:

Natural team

A natural team is composed of three athletes, with the best times, from the same country in the same age group. No further information is required from the team manager before the race.

Composed Team

A composed team consists of three athletes from the same country but belonging to different age groups who compete in the same race. If a nation can put together a natural team in one of the age groups concerned, a composed team is not allowed. A composed team competes in the age range of its youngest athlete, but the athletes will compete in their age group for the individual classifications.

An athlete from an older group who compete in a younger group (different start) will not be able to compete for the individual result.

Final Confirmation deadline for the composed Teams (at the TIC): 18:00 (6PM) of the day before the Event.

Medal Ceremonies

All medal ceremonies will take place in the specially prepared area, in the Main Stadium in Ribeira Brava. The exception will be the events that take place in Machico, the medal ceremony will be on the Machico promenade, next to the sand beach.

Athletes must present themselves in the ceremonial area at least 15 minutes before the medal ceremony according to the program of ceremonies that will be posted to the TIC and on the official notice boards.

Athletes must participate in ceremonies by wearing their official uniforms.

For the relay races, only the four athletes who participated in the final can take part in the awards. The diplomas for athletes or teams ranked from 1st to 3rd place will be given in the medal ceremony; the athletes who want to apply for the participation certificate with the placement must present themselves to the welcome center.

The medal ceremonies are an important part of the competition for each athlete and the ceremonies must be followed by everyone.

Medal Ceremonies Schedule

Medal Ceremonies Schedule will be published on the official bulletin board of all venues, at the info point and in the areas reserved for medal ceremonies. The timing for the ceremonies is tight, and it is therefore of the utmost importance to be on time.

Medals and Diplomas

A medal and a diploma are assigned for free to the first three athletes ranked. Diplomas from the 4th athlete on are available at the cost of € 3 and on request at the info point.

Competitors who are unable to receive their medals at the award ceremonies can pick them up at the TIC from the next day. If athletes are unable to collect their medals and their own diplomas, they can be requested by a team member by signing an official form at TIC. No medals will be delivered before the awards ceremony.

Doping Control

Doping Control tests will be conducted according to WA-WADA rules by the anti-doping agency.

Athletes selected for doping controls will be notified immediately after the end of the competition. A Chaperon will be appointed for each athlete and will accompany them to the Doping Control Centre. Personal documents are required (ID card - ID).

Drinks will be provided for those athletes who want them. Athletes should only drink sealed bottle drinks provided by the organizers. Athletes should be aware that refusal to supply a sample can make them susceptible to disqualification.

The athletes to be tested can invite a companion to the control center. A special pass will be provided to accompany the athlete to the doping control staff. The EMA doping control delegate and/or the LOC doping control delegate will personally check the doping controls, which will be conducted in accordance with WA rules and regulations.

1. Selection Procedures

The selection of athletes for the tests is done randomly and any athlete, regardless of their age and gender and the type of event they participate in, can be chosen. The procedural guidelines established by WADA are strictly observed in the tests of all athletes. If you are selected for a test, this will be reported by a test officer (Chaperon) who will be clearly identified and accredited as part of the test group. The athlete will be informed of his selection to undergo a doping test and the test officer will accompany him to the test control area. All competitors must be aware that rejection of a test will be considered as a positive doping test.

2. Testing Procedures

The accompanying person will accompany the athlete to the doping control center located in the competence stage where the test procedure will be fully explained by the control team. The athlete can request information on any question relating to the test procedure, during or after completing the required modules. Questions or complaints must be noted before signing the forms.

3. Athletes' Rights

An athlete selected for doping testing is normally informed immediately after completing an event. Chaperon will stay with the athlete until the athlete is presented in the test control area.

With the consent of the test manager and at any time, the athlete can:

- Attend a victory ceremony
- Compete in other races
- Receive the necessary medical assistance
- Fulfill media commitments
- Warm up (cool down) or cool off

4. Athletes' Responsibilities

It is athlete's responsibility to make sure that the following is done during the sample collection process. In general: be aware of and comply with WA/EMA/WADA anti-doping regulations. In case of tests:

- Follow the doping test procedure
- Check the urine sample until it is sealed in the sample collection kit
- Ensure that the sealed sample collection kit is protected and identified
- Ensure that all appropriate documentation is accurate, complete and signed

Note: if any part of the test procedure raises doubts, the concern must be recorded on the test form and the Team Manager must be informed. The doping test form must be retained by the athlete and should not be given to anyone else.

5. TUE - Therapeutic Use Exemption

In the event that the athlete is required to take drugs to treat a disease or condition that is on the list of prohibited substances, the exemption from therapeutic use (TUE) can give the athlete the authorization to take the medicine necessary.

6. Opening Ceremony

All EMACS 2025 competitors, officials and supporters are invited to participate in the official opening ceremony. All the teams are also invited to join the opening ceremony of the nations in official team uniform. The key details are as follows:

Date: Wednesday, 8 October

Meeting point before the Parade: from 5.00 to 6.00 PM at the Parque de Santa Catarina in Funchal.

Start Time of the Parade: 6.00 PM - Official Ceremony: Starts at Parque de Santa Catarina, goes down to Placa Central to the Igreja da Sé, goes up Rua João Tavira, and turns right towards Praça do Município, ending in front of Funchal City Hall.

7. Closing Ceremony

Closing and Flag ceremony will take place on 19 October at the Ribeira Brava Main Stadium between the M 4x400m relay and the W 4x400m relay.

If a filling is used, this must be inserted in such a manner that it is immovable. The centre of gravity of the head, less the link(s) and the handle, shall be brass or a shell of such metal, filled with lead or other solid material. The centre of gravity of the head, less the link(s) and the handle, shall not be more than 9MM from the center of the sphere. **Link:** The head shall be connected to the handle by means of metal link(s). PROCEDURE TO OBTAIN A VISA INVITATION LETTER

Visa, if required, should be obtained before leaving your Country, from the Portuguese Embassy or Consulate well in advance to ensure all the procedures are carried out in good time.

The following procedure is for requesting invitation letters to obtain visas:

- **1.** The athlete must first complete his/her registration and pay the entry fee.
- **2.** The athlete then submits a request for a visa invitation letter through his/her National Federation to the Organisers. The request must contain the following data:
- •Full name (first and last name as it appears in passport)
- •Gender
- Date of birth
- Passport number
- Passport expiry date
- •Position in the team (athlete or official)
- •Date of entry and departure from Italy
- •Proof of payment of the registration fee
- 3. The LOC will send a visa invitation letter
- **4.** Upon receipt of the invitation letter, the athlete may apply for an appointment at the relevant Embassy. If the National Federation does not validate the request, or if the Embassy refuses the appointment or the visa, EMA and the Organisers reserve the right to refund the entry fee (less any bank transfer fees). Refunds will only be granted upon presentation of valid proof (either a letter from the Federation or from the Embassy).



Transports

The shuttle service will depart, everyday, from Avenida do Mar (Palácio de São Lourenço), stopping at the Forum Madeira Shopping Center, passing through RG3, then heading towards the Câmara de Lobos Stadium and with its final destination being the Main Stadium - Centro Desportivo da Madeira - Ribeira Brava, with a frequency of one hour. For the competitions in Machico (road race walk) and Chão das Feiteiras (cross country), the shuttle will depart from Avenida do Mar (Palácio de São Lourenço). This service will only happen on the day of their competition. Schedules will be announced soon.

Currency

The currency is the Euro (€) which is made up of 100 cents. There are coins of 1, 2, 5, 10, 20 and 50 cents and 1 and 2 euros. Bank notes are of 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200 and 500. All the major international credit cards are accepted in hotels, shops and restaurants (Visa, Mastercard, Eurocard, American Express).

Tipping

Tipping in Portugal is not very common. The price of a product or service has service and taxes always included. So it's normal to pay the bill as it is.

If you like to tip anyway, it is totally acceptable. You can sometimes find a tipping jar at a bar. You can also round the bill up to nearest convenient figure.

Taxis

Official taxis can be identified with taxi sign. There are official taxi stops for customers or taxi can be ordered with phone.

The price of the taxi ride is based on the following parts: starting price, which is depending on the time of the day, travel rate affected by the number of passengers as well as time charge per minute.

Electricity

The electric current for use in homes and hotels, as in most of Western Europe countries, is 220 volts (50 Hz) and the plugs used are three round pins.

Local Time during the Championships UTC+00:00.

Driving

Right-hand traffic. Seatbelts are required for everyone travelling in a car or in a van, whether seated in the front or rear. It is prohibited to talk on a mobile phone while driving, without using a hands -free device. Drinking and driving is a punishable offence regardless of the road or location. If buses have seatbelts you are required to use them.

Water

Note that it's safe to drink tap water in Madeira Island.

Mobile Phone Networks

Mobile phone networks operate under 5G, 4G, 3G and 2G. Only phones that are manufactured to operate under these systems will work in Portugal. You are advised to contact your own country's mobile phone operator to determine if your country has an international roaming agreement with Portugal, which will allow temporary connection with the Portuguese networks.
